Day 1

- arrival at Wrocław Strachowice Airport
- transfer to the hotel and accommodation
- welcoming dinner
- evening walk through Wrocław - the Old Town Market Square
- lodging



Day 2

- breakfast
- sightseeing in Wrocław – Wrocław for the Assiduous
 - Panorama of the Battle of Racławice – it is one of few places in the world where one can admire the relic of nineteenth-century mass culture. A monumental painting (15x114m) transfers a viewer into a different reality and into a different time thanks to combination of some unique painting devices (special kind of perspective) and technical effects (lighting, artificial terrain, darkened tortuous passage). Panorama of the Battle of Racławice is the one and only extant Polish work of this kind.
 - the Market Square, Salt Market Square, Wrocław dwarfs – the history of bronze dwarfs, search for dwarfs
 - St. Elizabeth's Church
 - Old Shambles – monument commemorating Slaughter Animals – a perfect place for a photo. The history of medieval Wrocław butchers
 - Old City Prison
 - University of Wrocław
 - Museum of the University of Wrocław
 - Oratorium Marianum and Leopoldine Hall
 - Panorama of the city seen from the top of the Mathematical Tower
 - National Ossolioski Institute (the garden and baroque courtyard)
 - The Church of the Blessed Virgin Mary on Sand Island
 - Ostrów Tumski, The Cathedral of St. John the Baptist
 - View of Grunwaldzki Bridge and historic Water Tower
 - Old Town Promenade and Gondola Bay (it is possible to rent a gondola or a boat)
 - Brick Layers' Bastion – view of Ostrów Tumski
 - Dinner in a local restaurant and wheat beer tasting
 - Ship, steamship, or gondola cruise on the river Odra or a historic streetcar ride

- evening water, light, and sound performance – Millennium Fountain – one of the most beautiful fountains in Europe combines spectacular lights and holograms displayed on water walls with music which altogether leave indelible

 - The City Museum of Wrocław
 - Opera House, former City Theatre
 - Świdnicka Street, Statue of King Bolesław Chrobry
 - Liebich's Hill
 - Break for a cup of chocolate (hot or iced chocolate)
 - The White Stork Synagogue
 - the Market Square

Day 6

- breakfast
- transfer to Wieliczka
- sightseeing in one of the oldest salt mines in the world. The historic Wieliczka Salt Mine is the only mining facility in the world which operates continually from Middle Ages until today. Its original pits (galleries, inclined drifts, exploiting chambers, lakes, shafts) which total length is around 300 km are situated on nine levels which are 327 m deep. These pits illustrate stages of mining development over a span of all historical epochs. In 2009 the mine was visited by 1 million 65 thousand 857 guests, including 58% foreign tourists.

- a ride to Kazimierz – an old Jewish district
 - synagogue
 - Church at Skalka
 - Church of St. Catherine
 - a Jewish cemetery
- supper accompanied by Jewish and Gypsy live music

Day 7

- breakfast
- transfer to Oświęcim
- sightseeing in Auschwitz – this camp became a notorious symbol of terror, genocide, and Holocaust. It was established by Nazis in 1940 in the suburbs of Oświęcim which was one of numerous regions occupied by Germans during World War II. The name Oświęcim was converted into Auschwitz and remained the name of the camp. It is a destination of tourists from around the world.
- dinner
- sightseeing in Wadowice – this city is located around 50 km southwest of Kraków. Here, in 1920, Karol Wojtyła – the Pope John Paul II was born. Tourists who come to Wadowice most frequently visit Holy Father's house which is situated near the market square.

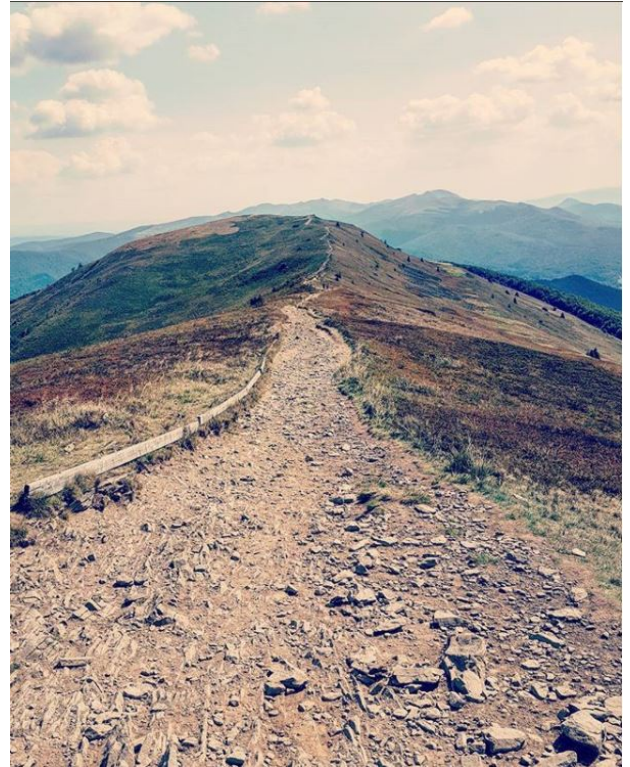

- transfer to Rzeszów sightseeing in Łańcut - Łańcut Castle is one of the most picturesque aristocratic mansions in Poland. It is famous for its beautiful interiors and an amazing collection of horse-drawn vehicles. The castle is surrounded by an old, charming park arranged in an English style where tourists can find various edifices which mirror everyday life of Łańcut mansion residents.
